Dear Parent

It is with deepest regret that I am having to inform you that following the announcement made by the Government yesterday, Wednesday 18th March 2020, Rawmarsh Sandhill will be closed from Friday 20th March 2020 for the foreseeable future in response to COVID-19.

The Government announced that schools, colleges and early years settings, nationwide will be closed to the vast majority of students as part of the country's ongoing response to COVID-19. It is our intention to remain open, in line with Government recommendations, with a skeleton staff providing support for the children of key workers. This is inclusive of:

- Children of NHS staff, police and delivery drivers
- Children who are open to Social Care
- Children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)

Thank you to those of you that have completed the online 'Parental Front Line staff' form. We will be using the information provided to identify the children whose parents are key workers. We will notify you via letter if we think that you fall into one of these categories. If you have not completed the form already and work for NHS staff, police etc. please can you go to the school website where you will find a link to the form or contact school. However, if you have an adult who can be available in the household to provide appropriate childcare please consider other families in greater need who may have both parents working in key front line roles.

It is very important to reiterate that children who do not fall into these groups should remain at home until further notice.

As I have previously outlined it is our civil duty to continue to provide an education to all of our students. Each and every student at Rawmarsh Sandhill is entitled to continue to receive education whilst they have been asked to remain at home. We have prepared a bank of work for your child to complete whilst absent from school to ensure that student education can still continue.

Children will receive a pack of activities and work including writing and maths tasks and research projects and activities. There will be continued access to our online website resources and class pages and these will be updated regularly by teaching staff.

We ask parents to support the school by encouraging children to complete the work set for them online as detailed above. Their teachers will update these work platforms regularly and communicate feedback with your child directly, either through Dojo or via their school e-mail address. Teachers have had guidance on the various methods of setting work remotely, and in most cases this relies on the teachers and students using online resources in some way. Given that the majority of students, or families, have some access to internet enabled phones, we believe this to be the best method of communication.
