



Re: COVID-19 – continuing school provision for children of front line staff

Dear Parents,

As you will be aware, the Prime Minister announced today that all schools and colleges in England will be closed as of Tuesday, 5th January, as part of the country's ongoing response to COVID-19.

As a school, we will do all we can to stay open for the children of front line staff as defined by the government, and for children with additional needs. We intend to offer this service during normal school hours: 8.50 – 3.10. Staff will be in school from 8.30 onwards.

Although this provision will be delivered through a skeleton staff, our intention is for the curriculum offer to continue to be broad, balanced and ambitious for all students.

If you have already identified as a key worker, you will be contacted during Tuesday 5th January about arrangements. If you are a front line worker and are the primary carer for your children, but you have not yet let us know that you wish your child to continue to attend school, please contact school by email (contactus@rawmarshsandhill.org), giving us the name and Year group of your child(ren) and the nature of your front line role.

I must stress that we need to know in advance who will be expected on school premises on Wednesday

We appreciate your continued support as we deal with this ever-changing situation and we will continue to keep in touch with any updates as the situation develops.
