**Pupil Premium Policy 2021-22**

**What is the Pupil Premium Grant?**

The aim of the Pupils Premium Grant is to raise achievement among disadvantaged pupils. The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals, pupils who are looked after or in care and pupils whose parents are in the armed services. It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent. However, measures will be included in the performance tables that will capture the achievement of those deprived pupils covered by the Pupil Premium. The Government also require schools to publish online details of how they have used the premium.

**How will Pupil Premium Grant be allocated at Rawmarsh Sandhill Primary School?**

Pupil Premium funding is allocated following a needs analysis which identifies priority classes, groups or individuals. In order to meet the above requirements, Rawmarsh Sandhill Primary School will ensure that provision is made through the following strands:

- Cognition and Learning
- Social, Emotional and Mental Health
- Communication and Interaction

Through termly assessments, pupil progress discussions and feedback from pupils and families, pupils will be tracked and provision altered as necessary.

**Key aims include:**

- Narrowing the gap or those pupils not on track to achieve age related expectation or who are making limited progress
- Providing early intervention and support to improve 'readiness for learning'
- Provide emotional and social support for disadvantaged pupils
- Develop stronger links with parents of disadvantaged children and offer parental support and development
- Improve attendance of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium
- Extend and provide opportunities for depth of understanding for those children who are working at greater depth

Making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged. We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. The Senior Leadership Team and Governors reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.

**Provision**

The range of provision the Governors and Trustees may consider making for this group could include:

- Providing small group work with an experienced teacher focussed on overcoming gaps in learning or elements of tactical teaching support
- Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through learning mentors, trained TAs or external agencies
- Partial funding of School Direct Student Placement providing extra support within classes
- Specialist provision through the support of the Speech and Language therapist and Well Being Counsellor.
- Increasing attendance levels and punctuality rates across the school with initiatives including breakfast and after school opportunities, which may include provision and support as well as access to resources and staffing
- Nurture provision from the Learning Mentor working with children and parents

- Enhancing curriculum provision in Oracy and maths to support engagement and enhancements in learning in school and at home.
- To provide opportunities for enrichment through a range of provision such as visits to places, visitors into school and residential.

All our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress moving children to at least age related expectations.

## **Reporting**

The pupil premium Leader - Mark Roddison - is responsible for producing a termly report for senior leadership and governors consisting of:

- The progress made towards narrowing the gap, by year group, for socially disadvantaged pupils
- An outline of the provision that was made during the term
- An evaluation of the cost effectiveness, in terms of the progress made by the pupils receiving a particular provision, when compared with other forms of support and any alterations to provision for the coming term.

Senior Leadership Team and Governors will ensure that a report on how Pupil Premium Grant is being used, a break down of all expenditure and evaluations of impact will be available on the school's website. This will be updated termly.

## **Funding**

Pupil premium funding will be calculated in line with 2021-22 legislation.
